



Pre-Op Spay/Neuter Information – Transport Patients

Appointments

Appointments are to be made in advance. Walk-ins will not be accepted.

Payment is to be made via cash, debit, Visa or Master Card at the time of booking, or at drop-off. We do not accept personal cheques. **Any cancellations must be made 48 hours prior to the appointment.**

Please note that deposits for canine/ feline surgeries are non-refundable unless a cancellation notice is received at least two weeks prior to the scheduled surgery date.

Pet Health and Condition

All patients must be healthy (no signs of **any** illness), of an ideal weight and of sufficient age for surgery (refer to our FAQ page). Any medical history should be disclosed as early as possible, to ensure that our vets consider the animal appropriate for surgery. Females must be finished nursing at least two weeks prior to surgery.

Pregnant felines can be spayed if they are not in the final stages, and are not yet lactating. Due to the exposure to narcotics, fetal animals removed at the time of spay will be humanely euthanized.

The Day Before Surgery

Please feed as close to drop-off as possible as your pet will be fasted overnight (water will be provided overnight). Please keep all dogs on leash a few days before surgery to prevent them from ingesting any foreign bodies such as sticks or garbage as the animal will be denied if these objects are vomited up prior to surgery as it poses an anesthetic. **Kittens and puppies under 4 months of age will be provided a small meal upon arrival and the morning of surgery.** If your animal vomits **anything other than bile or clear fluid** we will be unable to perform surgery that day, and we will work with you to reschedule the appointment. Please note a \$25.00 ineligibility fee in addition to the \$10.00 transportation fee will still be applied should this occur.

Drop Off

Your animal must arrive between 6:00 - 6:30pm the evening prior to surgery. Please note that the admission process can take up to an hour depending upon your place in line.

All cats and kittens must come in their own individual carriers, labeled with a name that corresponds to the paperwork. Dogs must be on a leash.

Pick Up

Pickup time is 5:00pm on the day of surgery for all surgical patients. We cannot accommodate later pick-ups or boarding so please ensure you have made the proper arrangements prior to booking your appointment.

Vaccines

To provide optimum protection, we strongly recommend that core vaccines (FVRCP or DA2PPV and Rabies), be given at least two weeks before surgery if your pet is not up to date (had vaccines within the last three years). We will request proof of vaccination at the time of drop-off (*This should be the signed vaccination certificate issued by your veterinarian*). Please bring the physical copy with you at the time of arrival for our intake staff to review. Please do not email or fax these records ahead of time unless instructed to do so. If you currently do not have a veterinarian, this is a good time to start a relationship to partner in your pet's future health.

Toronto Humane Society also offers a public vaccination service, please see our calendar of events to see dates that vaccination services will be offered.

We can provide booster vaccination services for \$45.00 at the time of surgery*

- i. This will include Rabies and FVRCP or DA2PPV
- ii. This is a combination price, the price will be reduced to only \$22.50 if your animal only requires one of these vaccines.

If you are unable to have your pet vaccinated prior to surgery you will be required to sign a waiver.

- i. No animal will leave the THS Spay/Neuter Service without being up to date on core and rabies vaccinations.

*Please note vaccinations done on the day of the procedure will be done during the anesthetic, usually at the end of the surgery. All vaccines carry a very low risk for severe (anaphylactic) reactions. There is a chance that a reaction might not be noticed immediately under these circumstances. You will be required to sign the authorization form acknowledging that you are aware of this risk. We are not responsible for any illnesses potentially transmitted to your pet at this clinic.
